Background


- We face some of the most expensive student health insurance in the Bay Area (\$7000+)
- Classmates have raised concerns about the quality of care of Vaden
- There are few avenues for structured feedback between administrators and students on healthcare
- Healthcare is an essential part of providing wellness on campus





Students did not seem to trust or recommend Vaden


On a scale 1 to 10 how likely are you to recommend Vaden to a friend / other classmate? 248 responses

Percent of Respondents Reporting Reason for scoring Vaden below a 7



WHEREAS a Stanford Health Care Survey was sent out to the student body and garnered 248 responses as of 4/29/23 consisting of, 32.7% of responses from FLI students, 19% consisting of International Students, 36.6% undergrads, and 69.8% of respondents had Cardinal Care.

WHEREAS the Net Promoter Score of Vaden was almost -57.4 based on the survey data below:

Need finding revealed two areas for advocacy

Create a Student Health Committee Ask for a Student Health Survey

- Meets need for formalized feedback to Vaden
- Allows students to learn more about how healthcare works on campus
- Promotes long term improvements to student health

- Formalize the survey we create
- Ask questions on quality and accessibility
- Balance undergrad health needs with grad students when it comes to insurance

VSHAC Draft Charter

Preamble

VSHAC is an advisory board that represents the entire student population at Stanford University to Stanford Vaden Health Services, the Executive Director of Vaden Health Center, and the Vice Provost of Student Affairs on matters regarding university healthcare administration.

VSHAC members can expect to gain an understanding of student healthcare services at Stanford and navigate issues in healthcare and insurance administration, positively influencing health and student well-being at Stanford.

Specific Goals

- Create an organized dialog between students and administration regarding
 - student physical and mental health wellness needs
 - quality and accessibility of care at Stanford and in the surrounding area for students
 - student preferences in the administration and fee structures of Stanford University's health insurance plan(s) and the Vaden Health Center
 - financial and accessibility barriers and ease of use of Vaden Health Services
 - educational and informational needs of students regarding healthcare
- Provide program and service advice and consultation
- Gather feedback on current student well-being and health services and emerging issues
- Be a conduit between aggrieved students willing to work with Vaden to improve and incorporate feedback.

Membership

Emphasize diversity of student voices

- Core members from Student Government offices (GSC, UGS, Exec, CPs, Nom Coms) and Vaden Health Care appointments asked to come to most meetings
- Additional members from campus community centers (e.g., Black House, A3C, El Centro, QRS, etc.), prioritizing voices of those historically marginalized in healthcare
- Any walk-in student who has attended the previous three consecutive VSHAC meetings
- Key administrators from Vaden Health Services and VPSA
